

Gifts from the Sisters of Mercy Enrich our Campus & Faith

We are happy to share some wonderful additions to Mercy that enrich our Catholic identity, beautify our campus, and deepen our connection to the Sisters of Mercy.

The Sisters of Mercy granted a conservation easement to our school, protecting over 30 acres of stunning natural land, including the beloved "Mercy Pond." This nature conservancy is now an official part of our grounds and features a variety of elements designed to promote reflection and prayer. Among these are the Stations of the Cross, a Prayer Labyrinth, a gazebo, walking trails, and the serene Upper Rouge River.

We are pleased to announce the relocation of a magnificent 7-foot tall bronze sculpture of Mary, created by renowned artist Joseph N. DeLauro. This statue, named Our Lady of Peace, is now positioned at the student flagpole entrance.

For over 55 years, she has graced the "Mercy Pond" on the adjacent former Sisters of Mercy property, and now, as the Patroness of our school, she will serve as a welcoming symbol of our Catholic faith and the Mercy Core Values. We are truly blessed to receive this beloved Our Lady of Peace statue, along with several items from the Sisters of Mercy Chapel.

These additions not only enhance our environment, but also deepen our spiritual and communal experience at Mercy High School. We look forward to enjoying these sacred treasures together. A special blessing ceremony is planned as part of the upcoming celebration for Mercy High School's 80th anniversary next fall.

Mary Reflection

Inspired By Faith

"And Mary treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart." Luke 2:19



Several months ago, I walked "across the pond" to take a look at the statue of Mary located on our grounds. The day was overcast, and the sky looked ominous as the wind rustled through the trees. I wondered if it was going to storm and if I should rush back to our Mercy school building instead.

As I walked, I began to reflect on the legacy of the Sisters of Mercy and how we stand on the shoulders of thousands of these holy women, including Catherine McAuley. Here at Mercy High School, we continue to benefit from the fruits of the Sisters' labor and the charism of mercy. In a world that so desperately needs peace and generosity, what a beautiful thing that the Sisters continue to give and sacrifice for young women like our students who walk our halls each day.

As I approached this gifted statue of Mary, I noticed its weathered surface, painted black to cover the worn bronze material underneath. All of this, along with the weather that day made the statue of Mary look very mysterious and perhaps even looming. I felt fearful. How often in my own faith life have I felt fear of the unknown - fear of the mysteries of life?

Looking up at Mary's face, I was struck by her expression.

The sculptor, Joseph N. DeLauro made some fascinating creative and artistic choices. Mary's eyes are closed and with a unique facial expression. She isn't smiling nor is she frowning. She looks deep in thought. Almost as if she is pondering the weight of the world - all of human history's famine, war, violence, and pain. Quite frankly she looks like she is holding back tears.


Her hands are spread out almost in a solemn blessing over the world. There is even a sadness to her posture. It reminds me of one of my favorite verses in the Gospel of Luke. It's just one simple sentence, "And Mary treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart." (Luke 2:19) It's such a small phrase in a powerful Gospel account. This verse comes after the birth narrative and after the shepherds traveled to meet the Christ child. I can only imagine how Mary must have felt in those early moments the night Jesus was born.

Did she know what was to come for her precious child, Jesus? Mary, the mother of Jesus, pondered the mystery of her Son and the suffering he would one day endure, in her heart. I would argue she must have intuitively understood but couldn't have known all the details. How could anyone imagine the horrors that she went through?

Mary understands what it's like to watch her child suffer. She has pondered it all. She continues to ponder and intercede for us when we too experience our own passion and crucifixion. She holds all human suffering in her heart.

I again had the opportunity to walk and visit our statue of Mary. Since I last saw her, many people have carefully restored the bronze. The statue has transformed. Our president, Dr. Cheryl Kreger, sent me a picture captioning it, "Our Lady of Peace."

I wholeheartedly agree with her interpretation. There is a newness to the quality of the statue. Again, a mystery. How could this be the same statue? Mary who bore all the darkness of the world can also hold light, rebirth, and hope that we so desperately need. The restored bronze seems to glow, encouraging me to ponder the mysteries of life.





It encourages me to really sit with the mystery of life. There are indeed dark and deeply painful Good Fridays. And, there are also Easter Sundays. In other words, Christ modeled for us the cycle of our life. Yes, we will experience pain, suffering, humiliation, and death. But, we will also bask in the light. We will experience friendship, compassion, liberation, and even joy.

In my work at Mercy High School I have the joy to walk and accompany young women in their faith journey. I see the face of our Blessed Mother Mary reflected in the faces of our Mercy students. Like the Sisters of Mercy, our students lead their lives compelled by mercy.

We pray that Mary, the Queen of all Saints and our school's patroness, continues to watch over and protect us in times of doubt, despair, and loneliness. My prayer is that our students know and love Jesus and his Blessed Mother Mary. That in times of pain and unrest they can pour their suffering into the loving hands of Our Lady of Peace. Because if anyone could understand what they are going through, it's her.

Our Lady of Peace, pray for us!




























Heart of Mercy


Vicky Kowalski has accrued sixty-seven seasons of coaching student athletes over forty-four years and counting. Coach K, as she is affectionately known, has made "an indelible impact on the school's athletic program and the lives of countless students," and has been recognized by her peers and community for her service and commitment. She was named Girls Golf Coach of the Year four times, the Catholic High School League Coach of the Year eighteen times, the Michigan Interscholastic Golf Coaches Association (MIGCA) Regional Coach of the Year six times, the MIGCA State Coach of the Year two times, and the National Girls Golf Coach of the year two times. Coach K was inducted into the Catholic High School Hall of Fame in 2007, the MIGCA Hall of Fame in 2009, the Michigan High School Interscholastic Bowling Coaches Hall of Fame in 2021, and the Mercy High School Athletic Hall of Fame in 2022.

Michael Venos' coaching career spans four decades and sixty-three seasons and is still actively coaching. Coach Venos has been honored many times for his coaching accomplishments and service to his sport. He was named the Oakland Press Coach of the Year three times, the Observer-Eccentric News Coach of the Year two times, the MISCA Zone Coach of the Year 2000, the MISCA State Coach of the Year four times, the National Federation of High School Coaches National Coach of the Year in 2017, and in 2016 he received the Matt Mann Award – Swimming Hall of Fame (MISCA's highest honor). Mike has also been inducted into the Catholic League Hall of Fame 2016, the Grand Blanc High School Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame 2019 and the Brother Rice Hall of Fame 2020.

Why is an all-girls' education beneficial?

ith Women's History Month happening in March, it is a time to appreciate all the steps forward to encountering sexism in all facets of society. Whether it is in the workplace, in education, in leadership positions, or in sports, women have taken strides to continue to be global changemakers.

Attending an all-girls' high school comes with questions and commentary about what the benefits actually are to being in a same-sex environment. Is it beneficial? What does it offer compared to co educational environments? Well, at Mercy High School, there are clear pros to having the all girls' learning space. The school has taken steps to provide the advantages prospective and current students are looking to gain out of their high school experience. In fact, Mercy is a member of the International Coalition of Girls Schools, an organization aimed at strengthening women's education inside and outside the classroom across the globe. As the need to empower girls continues to grow, girls' schools are more relevant than ever before.

The International Coalition of Girls Schools outlines different ways all-girls schools around the world are impacting the lives of girls. From increasing interest, participation and confidence in the STEM fields to fostering the voices and leadership skills of young individuals, the sometimes overlooked benefits of the schools. This coalition focuses on research, networking, professional development and advocacy. With its network expanding from our very own community of Mercy High School to Australia and Afghanistan, there is no shortage of empowering women around the world who are looking to become change makers.

Mercy has taken and will continue to take steps to exemplify these values which it can be seen in many of Mercy's graduating classes who excel in leadership, scholarship, character, community involvement and confidence.

"I think going to an all-girls' school taught me how to be more confident in myself," Olivia Gray '23 said. "Being in a womandominated environment showed me what true confidence looks like and how we should not be afraid to take leadership roles in any form of environment."

The International Coalition of Girls Schools supports the claim that all-girls' schools "foster increased interest and confidence in STEM" by indicating that Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math fields are more dominant in all-girls' environments.

According to a study by Goodman Research Group, "girls' school graduates are six times more likely to consider majoring in math, science and technology compared to girls who attended coeducational schools."

One fact that cannot be overlooked is Mercy's commitment to expanding participation in STEM- related activities and classes. Each year, Mercy looks to expand its course offerings to keep up with the ever changing interests and needs of this educational community, whether it is AP Psychology or AP Environmental Science in the past few years. It is apparent that these efforts have encouraged Mercy students to go into a variety of STEM fields when entering college.

Out of the 67 seniors surveyed in Mercy's graduating class of 2024, 65%, or 44 seniors, are planning to pursue a career in STEM or be a STEM major.

Fostering young voices and encouraging girls to advocate for themselves is a central focus at Mercy and fellow all-girls schools as they can dominate the classroom rather than being intimidated by their male counterparts. Without fear of being judged, girls can take charge of their education by participating more in the classroom and asking questions.

"I prefer an all-girls' school because I think that not having as much male influence around me has made me a better advocate for myself," senior Morgan Sarafa said. "I'm more likely to ask questions or go to a teacher for help because, at least in middle school, I felt judged or didn't want it to seem like I was trying too hard."

Cultivating voices of young women doesn't just stop in the classroom as Mercy offers more than 50 clubs and other extracurricular activities outside of our superb athletic program. By having all of these activities, Mercy provides the opportunity for girls to further their education beyond the classroom by taking on leadership roles.

"[Attending an all-girls' school], especially Mercy, helped a lot with advocacy, not just by asking questions, but also getting other things that I wanted like leadership positions," Sarafa said. "I don't think that I would've run for or asked for different positions that I did if there were other influences. A lot of times, women try to tone themselves down or please other people, but when you're surrounded by women who are also advocating for themselves, you feel a lot more comfortable doing the same thing."

Mercy offers many young women a chance to thrive in a supportive environment where they can grow in leadership, academics and extracurricular activities in preparation for a college learning experience. An all-girls school is able to focus on enhancing education through cultural awareness, academic excellence, and community involvement.


THREE-PEAT GOLF STATE CHAMPIONS

Sr. Mary Lisa Renfer, RSM DO '06 is the recipient of the 2024-2025 Lumen Christi Award. This annual award is Catholic Extensions' highest honor given to people who radiate and reveal the light of Christ present in the communities where they serve. In addition to being a Sister of Mercy, Sr. Mary Lisa is also a doctor of osteopathic medicine and works as the Medical Director of St. Mary's Legacy Clinic in Knoxville, TN. Sr. Mary Lisa and her team of staff and volunteers provide primary care to improve the lives of the poor and medically uninsured driving an RV throughout Appalachia and bringing care to anyone who is in need. Driven by her faith and compassion, Sister Mary Lisa said the clinic's goal "is to bring the love of Christ to them so that they know they have dignity and that they have worth." Last year, the free clinic performed nearly 1,500 patient visits and covered 11,000 miles. They recently added a new clinic site, bringing the total number up to 10. A majority of the patients served are not Catholic. The Lumen Christi Award comes with a \$50,000 grant to the mobile clinic. Sr. Mary Lisa is a remarkable graduate of our school and brings Christ's love to all that she serves, truly making a difference.

Rita and William (Bill) Valade Sr. were a faithfilled couple of modest means who valued Catholic education and

service. During their 62 years of marriage, they raised four children: William Valade (parent of MaryJane Valade '97 and Suzanne Valade Richardt '02), Patricia Valade Dalrick '69, Sr. Rita Valade '72, RSM and Maryann Valade Tyrchniewicz.

Mr. and Mrs. Valade did not attend college, but through hard work and judicious use of resources, sent their children to Catholic elementary and high schools. 
