The selected candidate will have the opportunity to further develop our renowned award winning Mercy student vocal group, the Mercyaires. Candidates must hold a JQ/JX (music) endorsement with experience focused on vocals.

Qualified applicants should skillfully demonstrate the following competencies and be prepared to teach in a welcoming and inspiring learning environment.

The selected applicant will:

- create lesson plans designed to support mastery of grade and skill level essential outcomes.
- prepare students and provide vocal performing opportunities for concerts, school Masses, community events and competitions.
- show a passion for inspiring and motivating students to grow in their Performing Arts talents.
- demonstrate instructional practices that engage students in conceptual thinking, promote problem solving and creativity, and challenge students to achieve high standards of content mastery.
- demonstrate the ability to produce a quality music program, including performance and theory.
- collaborate with all student and staff leaders for theatrical productions.
- recruit, employ, and oversee professional and/or student musicians for the spring musical.
- show willingness and ability to implement or collaborate on new and innovative events for community outreach, recruitment, and student engagement.

Applicants should visibly demonstrate a willingness to expand their knowledge and skills by participating in professional development opportunities in all areas including Diversity, Equity and Inclusion, attend a Protecting God's Children workshop and complete a background check.
