# Senior current steps

Will be covered in class meeting on 9/4

- ★ Counseling Tasks on SCOIR
  - Counselor Letter of Rec request
  - Teacher letter of recommendation
- ★ For Non-Common App Schools- move schools to "Applying or Applied"
- ★ Complete FERPA on SCOIR
- ★ Complete FERPA on Common App (don't download forms)
- ★ Add teacher recommender (if applicable) on SCOIR
- ★ Email they are using for applications

This year SCOIR has integrated with the Common App. Mercy opted in for this first year. We are asking for patience as the system updates the week of September 2nd. On 9/4 we will work on this with your students!



# First Student Meeting with Counselor

- ★ Have colleges listed in "Applying/Applied"
- ★ Essay plan
- ★ Teacher Request for letter of recommendation - not everyone will need a letter (MSU won't accept one)
- ★ College Application Timeline
- ★ FERPA
- ★ SAT/ACT
- ★ Email address used for applications

# College Essays and Applications



"I read your college application essay. First of all the word 'COLLEGE' has two 'L's."



# The Job of the Essay

- ★ Workhorse-
  - Do I know someone who would want to room with this student?
- ★ Conversational (appropriately)
- ★ Tells me something I can't see in the application
- ★ Reflection on the everyday

## Supplemental Essays

- ★ Needs to answer the question
- ★ College is asking for a reason



# FERPA

## Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

- ★ For College Applications it answers:
- ★ "Can my high school send my transcript and letters
- ★ "Can I see my letters of recommendation?"

Recommend **WAIVING** rights for the college application

(I do NOT want to see my letters, I waive my rights to see the letters, Granted, I hereby waive my rights)

# Testing

- ★ Test Required
- ★ Test Optional
- ★ Test Free
- ★ Test Preferred
- ★ Test Flexible

This is based on admissions, some schools are requiring scores for scholarships.





# Self Reporting Test Scores

- ★ Many colleges allow Self-reporting of scores
- ★ If applying test-optional to any school, do not include scores on the Common Application

# Sending Test Scores



Mercy High School does not send test scores

- ★ Students should always send their highest composite for schools that require tests
- ★ Additional scores can be sent in consultation with the counselor or an admissions representative
- ★ Counselors are available to consult about test optional schools



# Financial Aid

- ★ Need Based Aid - Complete FAFSA (comes out October 1st\*) and CSS profile if required
- ★ Merit aid - may come at time of acceptance
- ★ Some schools have no merit aid - but match 100% of demonstrated need
- ★ Never too early to apply for scholarships - don't wait until March when your need based packages come out



# Financial Aid Continued

- ★ Financial Aid Presentation - October 23rd 7pm
- ★ FAFSA targeted to open November 1st
- ★ CSS opens on October 1st
  - Not all schools take the CSS profile so only complete if your student is applying to a CSS school
- ★ Mercy regularly updates scholarship list on Schoology
- ★ Student sign up for Going Merry (invite in Schoology) for more scholarships
- ★ Goal is to complete FAFSA and CSS (if required) before the end of January 2026.



# Reminder Re-Cap

- ★ Schools love to “remind” you to submit transcripts immediately upon application submission - check SCOIR to see if the transcript was already sent
- ★ MSU - Goal to submit around October 15th
- ★ U of M - Goal to submit by October 25th
- ★ Sign up for College Visits
- ★ ACT/SAT Scores - Student sends these to the schools
- ★ May 1st national day is the required day to make a deposit to a college

# How you can help in the process...

- ★ Set a time once a week to talk about college
- ★ When you are feeling overwhelmed talk to someone other than your student - they are navigating this too
- ★ Normalize the transition





# Student/Family Responsibilities

- Complete applications
- Know testing policy of schools
- Know if your schools require official test scores or if they allow self-reported scores
- Complete forms on Scoir
- Update Scoir with decisions
- Communicate schedule changes with your colleges if changed after application submitted

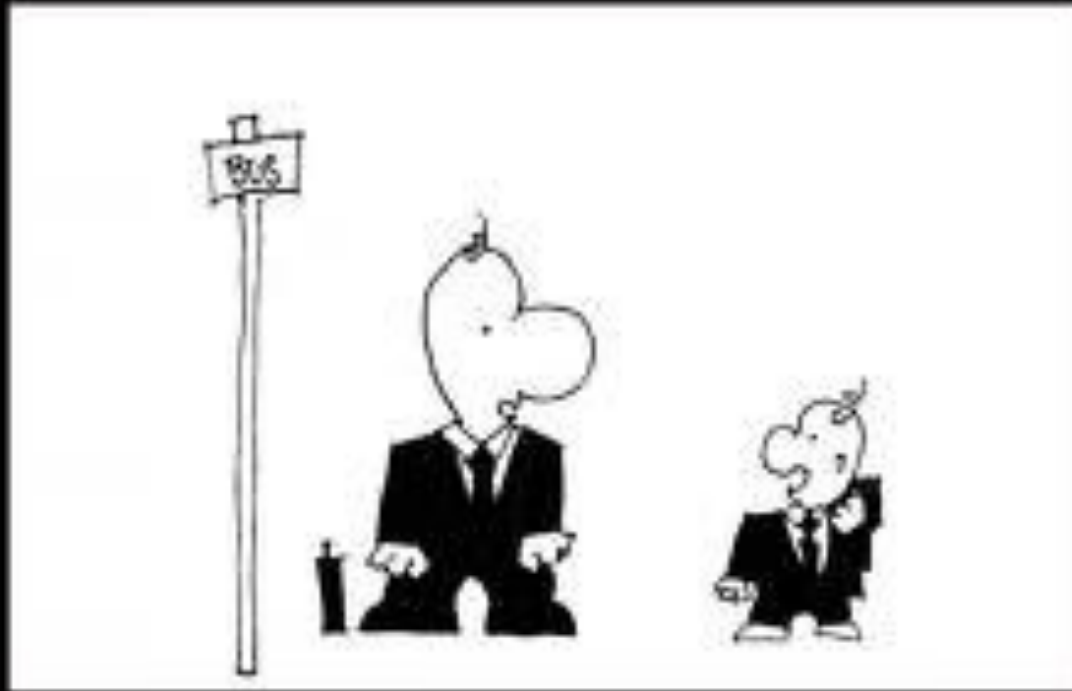
Fall in fear, stay in fear,
