Mercy High School Michigan was founded in 1945. The student body is comprised of young women from over 57 metropolitan Detroit communities, giving Mercy a rich, multi-ethnic constituency from diverse, socio-economic backgrounds. Current Mercy Enrollment 9-12: 435; 18% of students identify as Black/African-American, 3% of students identify as Hispanic, 2% of students identify as East Asian, 1% of students identify as South Asian, 4% of students identify as Arab/Middle Eastern, 12% of students identify as multiracial persons of color; 64% of students are Catholic; 57% of students receiving gift aid.

## **ADVANCED PLACEMENT, HONORS and DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES**

Students typically begin AP courses in the junior year. Placement in first-year Honors courses is determined by the Mercy High School Placement Test and individual family conversations. After the first year, students are free to enroll in any Honors or AP course and receive guidance from their teachers and school counselors.

In the 2024-2025 school year, 385 AP exams were administered. 24% received a 3, 32% received a 4, and 19% received a 5 on their respective AP exam.
