Mercy High School Dance Policies

We are proud of our Mercy students and look forward to hosting the Homecoming Dance. Thank you for your partnership in following these policies to ensure an enjoyable dance for all!

General Policies

- Students must arrive by 8:00pm.
- Once the student leaves, there is no re-entry.
- Drinking of alcohol, smoking, vaping are prohibited. The use of any substance that is mind altering or affects the
 demeanor of the student will not be tolerated. No outside beverages may be brought into the school building.
 Any student suspected of being under the influence of any intoxicants, including having an odor of intoxicants is
 subject to a breathalyzer and/or police intervention. The Mercy drug and alcohol policy will be followed.
- If any student is found to be under the influence, parents/guardians will be called and must pick up the student immediately.
- The guidelines for dancing are "face-to-face and leave space." Grinding and other forms of provocative dancing will not be tolerated.
- Making out will not be tolerated.
- Respect must be shown to all adults, chaperones and peers at all times.
- There are coat racks available, however, Mercy is not responsible for misplaced or stolen items.

Attire - Both Mercy students and their guests must adhere to the following guidelines:

Females

- Dresses may not have a split that is higher than mid-thigh (fingertip length).
- Dress must be at least fingertip length.
- Dresses must fit properly, not too tight and no excessive cleavage (extending below the bustline).
- Dresses may be backless as long as the skirt part begins at or above the waist.
- Cut-outs or mesh portions that expose the body may not appear in inappropriate areas.
- Midriffs may not be exposed. Two-piece dresses or skirts and tops must overlap at the waist.
- Pinning will not be allowed as an alteration.
- Shoes must be worn at all times.

Males

- Dress pants or khakis.
- Shirts must be worn at all times.
- Shoes must be worn at all times.

Failure to follow these dance policies may result in a parent/guardian being contacted and removal from the dance. Additional disciplinary actions, including police involvement, may be applicable for policy violations. Any student who is considered to be under the influence must be picked up by a parent/guardian. There will be no refunds if a student or guest is asked to leave the dance.
