Inspired by Detroit's storied
French heritage and the timeless
elegance of French social
traditions, the Mercy High School
French Honor Society (Chapter
493 of Société Honoraire de

inaugural Dîner en Blanc—a

Parisian event launched over
three decades ago. Mirroring the

Throughout March, Honor Society members dedicated themselves to crafting an enchanting atmosphere. Students handcrafted 1,000 white tissue paper flowers to adorn the venue, draped the ceiling with white linen, and decorated tables with white and gold accents. Dimmed lights and glowing candles set a magical ambiance. Guests, dressed entirely in white, were warmly welcomed by our members and invited to take seats along elegantly arranged rows of tables.

The evening began with a brief history of Dîner en Blanc, followed by a heartfelt prayer recited in French by an Honor Society member, setting a warm and reflective tone. Guests enjoyed a classic French menu featuring quiche, salade, baguettes, pâtisseries, fromage, and fruit, complemented by captivating performances from the Mercy Mimes, who evoked the artistry of Marcel Marceau in several delightful acts.
